Impact - Headline Data 2017 to 2018

At Hart Primary School , we measure the impact of funding through pupil achievement (attainment and progress) and attendance; comparing pupils in receipt of pupil premium with similar groups nationally and pupils not in receipt of pupil premium. We also aim to broaden pupils' experiences.

2017-18 Pupil Premium funding helped make the following differences:

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| Attendance Data | The gap in attendance between those in receipt of Pupil Premium and those not in receipt of Pupil Premium is closing : In Autumn/Spring 18 , the attendance of Non Ever 6 pupils was 96.7%. The attendance of EVER 6 pupils was 96.3% (National 94.1%). |
