Science - Plants


Key Vocabulary:

Nutrients: a substance that provides nourishment essential for the maintenance of life and for growth

Pollination: the transfer of pollen to a stigma, ovule, flower, or plant to allow fertilization

Seed dispersal: is the movement, spread or transport of **seeds** away from the parent plant:

Life cycle: the series of changes in the life of an organism including reproduction




Carpel: the female part of the flower anther- produces male cells

Filamnet- holds up the anther **style**- holds up the stigma & transports the pollen to the ovary

stigma- female part of the flower that is sticky & collects pollen grains

To generate ideas considering the purpose for which they are designing.


To develop clear ideas of what needs to be done

Geography- North America Key historical figure - Christopher Columbus Key Vocabulary

Atlas- a book of maps or charts

Globe- a spherical representation of the earth or of the constellations with a map on the surface
