Questions to Extend and Deepen Understanding

While the children are completing the challenge, you may wish you ask them the following questions:

- Can you explain to me what estimation means?
- How does looking for groups help you to estimate?
- Which challenge card is closest to ten?
- Can you talk to me about how you checked the number of pom-poms?

Challenge Set-Up Instructions

1. Print out the challenge cards for the children to either use independently in the maths area or with adult input.
2. You may wish to use jars of pom-poms as an alternative to the pictures of pom-poms on the challenge cards.
3. To challenge the children further, you may wish to ask them to estimate the number of pom-poms in the jars initially, then tip them on to a plate to estimate then count again.
4. The questions used within the chilli challenges will deepen mathematical understanding and help to develop mastery of counting.

What Are We Learning?

We are learning how to name and describe 3D shapes.

How to Set up the Challenge

- Make a collection of 3D shapes from your home, such as a tin of food (cylinder), a ball (sphere), a dice (cube), a cereal packet (cuboid) and an ice cream cone (cone).
- Make a simple ramp.

How to Get Your Child Thinking

- Do you know the names of these 3D shapes?
- Can you tell me about the shapes?
- How are they the same? How are they different?
- Which shapes do you think will be good at rolling? Why?
- Which shapes have curved surfaces? Which shapes have flat faces?
- Which shapes rolled? Why did they roll? Why didn't these shapes roll?
- What have you learnt about shapes that roll?



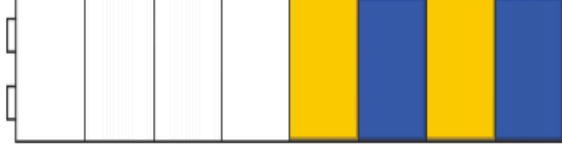
Does It Roll?

- Test the shapes by placing them at the top of the ramp.
- Which shapes rolled?

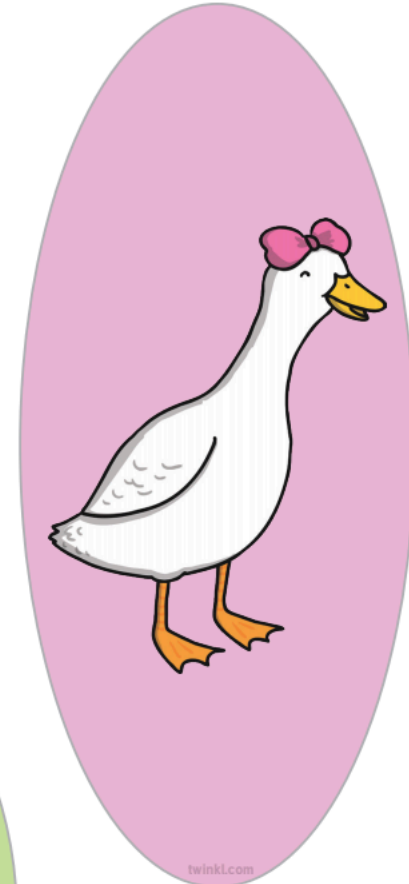

Star Jumps

1. Start with your feet close together.
2. Jump and land with your feet wide apart.
3. Stretch your arms out above your head.
4. Jump your feet in and your arms down.

Running and Punching

1. Run on the spot.
2. Punch your hands forwards at shoulder height.
3. Keep your knees high.
