Explore edible eggs

There are different types of eggs that we can eat including chicken eggs, duck eggs and goose eggs.

We use eggs to make lots of edible things such as omelette, cake, Yorkshire puddings and pancakes!

Exploring Seasons

We have four seasons Autumn, Winter, Spring and Summer. Each season has its own light, temperature and weather patterns.

In **Autumn**, the amount of time it is light for becomes less, the leaves start to change colour and fall off the trees.

In **Winter**, we have colder weather (sometimes snow and frost), the trees have no leaves and the amount of time it is light during the day is at its shortest.

In **Spring**, the weather usually turns warmer, trees begin to grow their leaves, plants start to flower and young animals such as chicks and lambs are born.

In **Summer**, the weather is usually warm, trees have full green leaves and the amount of time it is light for during the day is longer.
