The Natural World - Materials

Key Vocabulary

waterproof, water resistant, absorbent, stretchy, tough, warm, plastic, wood, metal, paper, glass

Key Knowledge

Material is what something is made of.
Waterproof means that water cannot get through the material and will stay dry.
Water resistant means eventually water will get through the material.
If something is absorbent, then it soaks up the liquid.
If something is stretchy it can be made longer or wider.
Tough means something is strong and will not break easily.

Key Vocabulary

Winter, snow, frost, weather

Key Knowledge

Winter is the coldest season.
In winter we have colder weather, **sometimes snow and frost**, the trees have no leaves.

Key Knowledge

A form of transport is something that takes or carries (people or goods) from one place to another.
Transport was different a long time ago.
There were no cars a long time ago.
Transport is faster now.
People travelled by horse and cart or on foot in the past.

Key Knowledge

When people talk to God it is called prayer.

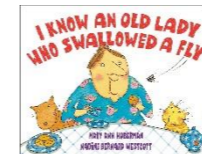
