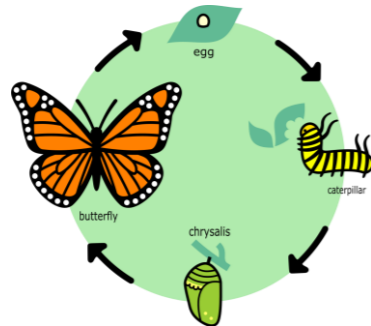
Science: Animals, Including Humans

Key Question: I wrote to the zoo to send me a pet. They sent me this... How do I make it survive?

Key Vocabulary: offspring, reproduce, survive, live young

Key Knowledge:

That animals including humans have offspring which grow into adults. Some animals lay eggs whereas some have live young. To know examples of animals which have young that look similar and different to their parents for example, frogs and butterflies. The basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival are water, food, and air. To understand that if an animal is ill it needs medicine to help it survive. Exercise and hygiene are important for humans and animals to have a healthy life.



PE: Dance - Bollywood

Key Vocabulary: travel (walk, run, sidestep, skip, hop, crawl), mirror
The deer, the flag, the lotus



Key Knowledge:

I can travel in different ways and use these to create my own movements. Bollywood dance is the dance form used in Indian films. Hand gestures in the dance are called Mudras and they help us to tell stories.

Computing: Keyboard Skills

Key Vocabulary:

keyboard toolbar edit font shift key image document insert



Key Knowledge:

Writing can be edited using the arrow keys on a computer or laptop. The keys on each keyboard are in the same place - QWERTY keyboard. The shift key is used to type capital letters and symbols on a keyboard. The toolbar in Word can help us to change and edit text in a document. An image can be inserted into a document from the internet or from a saved place on the computer on a keyboard.

Art: L.S.Lowry

Commission:

Create a landscape composition of Hartlepool in the style of Lowry



Key Vocabulary:

artist, industrial, landscape, brushstroke, load, watercolour paints, tint, shade, composition, sketch, charcoal

Key Knowledge:

L. S. Lowry painted industrial landscapes in the north of England. He painted in a simple style and used limited colours. Some famous paintings that Lowry painted were Going to the Match, Thurso and Playgroundology. We can add black to colours to create shades and white to create tints. We load the brush with paint and we can create different brushstrokes. Features are arranged in a painting to create a composition. We can create a light sketch with a pencil by not pressing on too hard.

RE: What do Christians believe God is like?

Key Vocabulary: forgiveness, forgiving, parable

Key Knowledge:

Christians believe God is loving, kind, fair and forgiving and a King. A parable is a special sort of story that was told by Jesus to help people learn or understand ideas. They have hidden messages or meanings. The parable of the Lost Son teaches that God is loving and forgiving like a parent. Seeking forgiveness and forgiveness are important and I can share ways that we show this in school. For example, we can say sorry to God and others and we can make a fresh start.



British Value: Mutual Respect and Tolerance

Key Vocabulary: gender, cultural background, unique

Key Knowledge:

There are similarities and differences in people's likes and dislikes, gender, appearance, beliefs, cultural background and families. It is important to respect and celebrate our differences. People have some things in common but we are all unique.



PHSE: Zippy's Friends: Making and breaking relationships

Key Vocabulary: loneliness, lonely, relationship

Key Knowledge:

We can take care of our friends by thinking about their feelings. We can take care of our friends by showing compassion when they are sad or hurt. We can keep our friends by showing them they can trust us to be kind and fair. We can help people when they are lonely by smiling at them, talking to them and including them in our play and our conversation. We can make new friends by doing this too.



History: Why are Edith Cavell, Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale important in healthcare?

Key Vocabulary:

inspiration, medicine, health, welfare, nation, contribution, profession, mixed-heritage, discrimination

Key Knowledge:

Significant people can make a difference to the world by the contribution they make. Florence Nightingale was a nurse in the Crimean war. She was known as the Lady with the Lamp. Florence Nightingale saw dirty hospitals and improved them by making them clean. She trained other nurses to do this too. Mary Seacole was a British-Jamaican nurse of mixed heritage. She went onto the battlefields of the Crimean war to care for the soldiers as well as nursing them at her British hotel. Edith Cavell nursed without discrimination. She nursed men from 'both sides' of the First World War in Belgium. She helped soldiers escape from the Germans. These women were courageous advocates because they stood up for what they believed in and helped people, even when it was difficult and dangerous. They inspired many people to become nurses. They all treated soldiers during wartimes. Mary had to overcome discrimination because she was a woman of colour. Florence and Mary looked after soldiers in the Crimean War but Edith was a nurse in World War I. Edith and Florence worked in hospitals but Mary had a "hotel". Mary and Florence died when they were old but Edith was executed. We find out about them by looking at sources such as history books.



Music:

First Thing Music/ Percussion music family

Key Vocabulary:

ta te-te rhythm notation music family percussion
Beat half-beat drum piano tambourine triangle xylophone maracas cymbals claves

Key Knowledge:

One beat is known as ta and half beats are known as te-te. I can read simple rhythms by saying ta for one beat and te-te for the half beats. A percussion instrument is any instrument that makes a sound when it is hit, shaken, or scraped. I can sort instruments into percussion and non-percussion. I can make a sound louder/softer on a percussion instrument.
