Key Vocabulary

Habitat, minibeast, animal, plant, living, leaves, change, evergreen, decay, rot, winter

Key Knowledge

Other living things share our school such as plants and minibeasts.

A habitat is the home of an animal or plant.

Minibeasts like dark, damp habitats.

Decay means to rot. Leave and food can decay.

Some minibeasts like to live in decaying food and leaves.

In winter, most trees lose all of their leaves.

Some trees are ever green which means they have their leaves all year round.

Key Knowledge

We can order times in our lives into chronological order.

Chronological order is ordering things that happen in order of when they happened.

Materials used to build houses in the past were different to materials that we can use to build houses today.

In the past houses were built from stone and mud and materials people could find naturally.

It makes me feel happy when I help my friend.


We can be friends with anyone, no matter where they come from or if they look different.

Key Knowledge

A print is a mark made on the paper using a colour or pattern

We can use our fingers, hands and feet to make a print.

We can use sponges and rollers to create print.

We can use natural objects like leaves, sticks and bricks to print.

Key Knowledge

A rhythm is a repeating pattern of sound.
