## Understanding The World

### The Natural World (Science)- How can I care for living things?

#### Key Vocabulary

Egg, hatching, chick, chicken, hatch, lifecycle, down, feathers, hen, Cockerel, incubator, living things, air, water, shelter.

#### Key Knowledge

Chicken eggs can be brown, white, blue, bluish green and pink.

The hen keeps the eggs warm by sitting on them. If the hen is not there then the eggs are kept warm inside an incubator.

Baby chickens are called chicks. Female chickens are called hens and male chickens are called cockerels.

The chick hatches from an egg. It pecks a hole in the shell with its egg tooth.

They are covered with tiny, soft, fluffy feathers called down to keep them warm.

All living things have a life cycle and change as they grow, including us as humans.

Living things need air, water and shelter.

#### Key Knowledge

Some places have different features to the place we live.

I know that some places have different features to the place we live such as islands, mountains, lakes and waterfalls.

#### Expressive Arts and Design

#### Investigation Questions:

Clay, tools, pinch, twist, spikey, pointy, shape, roll, press, pull, shape names.

#### Key Knowledge

We can make different shapes with clay.

We can roll, twist and pinch clay.

We can use modelling tools to make marks in the clay.

#### Key Vocabulary

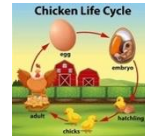

An instruction is a direction or an order.

We can follow instructions from someone else and we can give instructions to someone else.

### Religious Education – Why do Christians put in a cross in an Easter Garden?

#### Key Vocabulary

cross, Easter, repent, celebrate, palm cross.

#### Key Knowledge:

Palm crosses are a special symbol, or a reminder for Christians.

The cross reminds us of Jesus who died for us.

Christians use crosses to celebrate Easter at home and at church  
Christians recognize that sometimes things they think, say or do is wrong and that they need to say sorry (repent).

Christians believe that God forgives even though it is not always easy to say sorry
