The Natural World: Science - What bubbles can you make?

Key Vocabulary

Bubble, Soap film, bubble mixture, bubble wand, blow, air.

Key Knowledge

A bubble is air wrapped up in a soapy film.

Soap film is made from soap and water.

You blow through a bubble wand to make a bubble.

Bubbles can be lots of different sizes.

The bigger the hole in the bubble wand the bigger the bubble.

Key Vocabulary

Celebrate, wedding, birthday, Christmas, New Year, proud

Key Knowledge-

We celebrate lots of different things at home and in school.

We can celebrate a birth, birthdays, christenings, weddings and key events like Christmas and New Year.

When we celebrate, we can use candles, flowers, special clothes and special foods as part of the celebration.

We celebrate when we win a game, are proud of what we have done or are proud of our friends.

Key Vocabulary

Computer, laptop, mouse, mouse pad, move, click, cursor, keyboard, letters, numbers, symbols, log in, log out

Key Knowledge

A computer has a keyboard and a mouse or mouse pad.

A keyboard has letters, numbers and symbols on it and I can press them.

A cursor can be moved by using our hand or finger to move the mouse. We can click the mouse to choose something.

We need to log into something to use it.

We need to log out of something so nobody else can use our accounts (link to e-safety).

Key Knowledge

To draw something, we need to observe it closely.

We can draw something by closed shapes and lines.

We can use powder paint and water colours to paint colour onto a picture.

We need to add water to powder paint and water colours.

We need to observe the object closely to know what colour to use.

I can ride towards a target on a balance bike.

To ride towards a target, I need to steer in the right direction

To steer the bike, I need to use the handle bars.

To turn left, I need to steer left.

To turn right, I need to steer right.

Key Knowledge

We show respect for one another by being kind and accepting that we are different.

Each person is unique and valuable.

There are lots of different events where people feel welcomed, special and valued, such as celebrating birth.

In Christianity and Judaism, the celebration is called Baptism.

For Islam it is a ceremony to say thank you for the gift of a baby.

Hindu's show their siblings are special through the ceremony Rakhi – this is where sister ties a Rakhi band of gold or red threads around the right hand of her brother.
