


Geography Topic: The United Kingdom

<u>New Vocabulary</u>	
United Kingdom	The United Kingdom is an island country made up of four smaller countries: England, Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales.
city	A place where many people live together. It is larger than a town.
capital city	Where the government of the country is based.
landmark	An important place or feature and they help you know where you are
population	The number of people living in a certain place.
port	A place where boats can come and go to unload their supplies/people.
tourist	A person who is visiting and travelling to a place for pleasure.
office	A building designed for office workers to work in.

The United Kingdom is surrounded by the Atlantic Ocean, the North Sea, the English Channel and the Irish Sea.
