
Vikings came from Scandinavia and Norway. They were mainly farmers, traders and skilled craftsmen. The Vikings first arrived in Britain around AD 787 and in AD 793 they raided and pillaged the monastery at Lindisfarne in Northumbria. The Vikings came to Britain looking for items to steal and

trade. They also wanted land that they could claim as their

own.

The Vikings sacked York because it was a city situated by two rivers. This was considered good for trade and defence.
