Homes are safe but can have dangers in them.

Some hazards in the home, such as knives and sharp tools, pose such a risk that they can only be bought by adults over 18.

Liquids in the home, such as bleach and medicines that are not prescribed to you can seriously harm us and should never be drank.

Smoke alarms are essential in the home to alert people of a fire.

People who are trained to help you are the police, fire brigade, medics and people who work in school.
