What is FASD Network UK?	FASD Network UK was set up by Maria Catterick in 2011 due to her experiences as a caregiver of children with FASD. Her background is in learning disabilities and social care. The organisation provides information and support to anyone who is living with or supporting people with the effects of prenatal alcohol exposure.
Course Aim:	This session will offer an introduction to FASD with the aim of giving participants a general understanding of FASD and how to recognise and support children and young people with this condition.
Learning Objectives:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To examine how alcohol harm is caused and how to prevent it • To understand the signs and symptoms and diagnosis of FASD • To identify short and long term impacts of FASD • To identify strategies to support individuals affected by this condition. • To consider the support needs of children within educational settings. • To recognise the role of multi-agency professionals to support children and families.
Who Should Attend:	This session is suitable for those involved in the education and pastoral support of children and young people within educational settings as well as those supporting families of children who are affected.
