<u>History</u>

- What does Hartlepool mean? Finding out about the Anglo Saxon naming of Hartlepool as well as St. Hilda of Hartlepool.
- History of the Headland, how has it changed, using research to find out what it used to be like
- The story of the Monkey of Hartlepool during the Napoleonic war
- The Napoleonic war time line of when, primary & secondary sources of what it was like (1803, 20th November 1815)
- Sailing ships and their names: Schooner, Full rigged ship (world's largest ship 439 feet in length, accommodation up to 227 guests), Lugger (traditional fishing boat used of the coast of England, France and Scotland) The Trincomalee (frigate built just after the Napoleonic war, it cost £23000, journey from India to England cost £6600)



Geography

Key Question: Where is Hartlepool in relation to other countries in the Napoleonic war? Looking at where Hartlepool is in the UK and how the Headland is in a prime location for fishing and shipping.



<u>Vocab</u>: Headland, locate countries from the Napoleonic war: naming and locating the following countries and counties: France, Austria, Russia, Britain, Cleveland, Durham, Teesside, Middlesbrough and Hartlepool (West and Old Hartlepool), North Sea and English Channel, locating and using 8 points of a compass, grid references, longitude and latitude.

<u>Art</u>

<u>Vocab</u>: primary (a group of colours from which all other colours can be obtained by mixing)/secondary colours (a colour resulting from the mixing of two primary colours), mood, mediums, techniques, observe, watercolour.

<u>Science</u>

The importance of nutrition in our diets as well as the skeleton and muscle groups. To know the food group needed for a balanced diet.

<u>Vocab</u>: nutrients, diet, vitamins, minerals, food groups (carbohydrates, fats and sugars, protein, dairy), muscles, skeleton, scurvy, vitamins, deficiency, rickets

<u>Key Question</u>: How did sailors survive and keep healthy on ships during the Napoleonic war?

<u>Music</u>

To know what a sea shanty is: a type of work song that was once commonly sung to accompany labour on board large merchant sailing vessels. To sing as a collective with instrumental playing. To understand why sailors used sea shanties.

Vocab: verse, chorus, rhythm, timing, fret, lyrics, chords, staff
