## Science – Plants

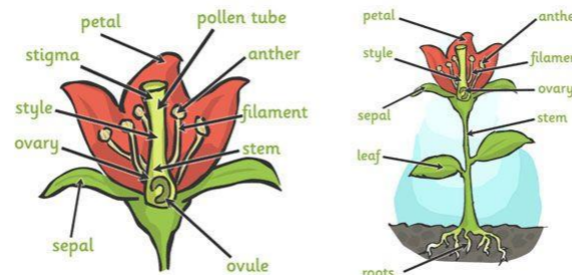
### Key Vocabulary:

**Nutrients:** a substance that provides nourishment essential for the maintenance of life and for growth

**Pollination:** the transfer of pollen to a stigma, ovule, flower, or plant to allow fertilization

**Seed dispersal:** is the movement, spread or transport of **seeds** away from the parent plant:

**Life cycle:** the series of changes in the life of an organism including reproduction

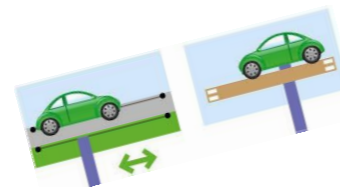


**Carpel:** the female part of the flower **anther-** produces male cells

**Filament-** holds up the anther **style-** holds up the stigma & transports the pollen to the ovary

**Stigma-** female part of the flower that is sticky & collects pollen grains

### Design and Technology – Mechanisms- moving toys To make a moving picture showing a predator and its prey.



#### Key Vocabulary:

Slider- move up and down and from side to side

Cam- a projection on a rotating part in machinery,

Handle- part of an object for moving, holding or carrying easily

Components-a part or element of a larger whole, especially a part of a machine or vehicle

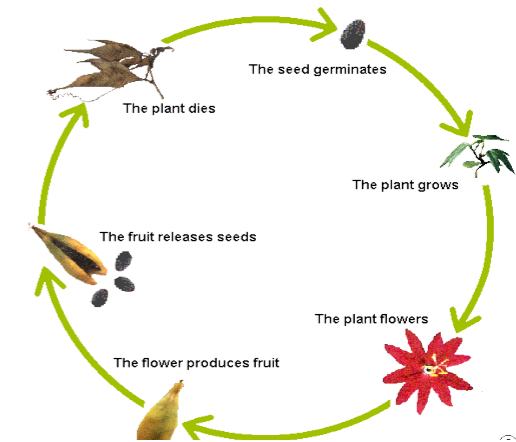
To generate ideas considering the purpose for which they are designing.

#### Key Vocabulary

Atlas- a book of maps or charts

Globe- a spherical representation of the earth or of the constellations with a map on the surface

Human features & Physical features- places are jointly characterised by their physical and human properties. Their physical characteristics include landforms, climate, soils and hydrology. Things such as language, region, political systems are human features.

To locate the world's countries, using maps to focus on South America, concentrating on their environmental regions and key physical and human characteristics, and major cities.
