





## Early Years VE Day Commemoration learning tasks

## <u>Being imaginative</u>

Have your own tea party with teddy bears or toys. What are you going to wear? Can you draw or write about your party? 9 wonder if the teddies like 'proper' cups of English tea. 30-50 months - Engages in imaginative role-play based on own first-hand experiences. Builds stories around toys. Uses available resources to create props to support role-play 40-60 months - Introduces a storyline or narrative into their play. Creates simple representations of events. Early Learning Goal - They represent their own ideas, thoughts and feelings through design and technology, art, music, dance, role play and





<u>Materials</u> Make British party food or bunting for a party.

30-50 months - Explores colour and how colours can be changed. Realises tools can be used for a purpose. 40-60 months - Constructs with a purpose in mind, using a variety of resources. Uses simple tools and techniques competently and appropriately. Early Learning Goal - They safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function.

## <u>Media</u>

Listen and dance to some traditional British music. Celebrate by playing your favourite instrument. What different sounds can you make?



30- 50 months - Enjoys joining in with dancing and ring games. Sings a few familiar songs. Beginning to move rhythmically. Imitates movement in response to music. Taps out simple repeated rhythms. Explores and learns how sounds can be changed. 40-60 months - Begins to build a repertoire of songs and dances, Explores the different sounds of instruments, Early Learning Goal - Children sing songs, make music and dance, and experiment with ways of changing them.



<u>Understanding the world</u>

Learn about British war-veteran Captain Tom Moore and the fantastic work he is doing to raise money for the NHS. Do you have any family members that went to war? 9 wonder if you could look at old photographs and talk about what happened on VE day in 1945.

30-50 months - Recognises and describes special times or events for family or friends 40-60 months - Enjoy joining in with family customs and routines. Early Learning Goal - Children talk about past and present events in their own lives and in the lives of family members.
