








Year 3/4 VE Day Commemoration learning tasks.

Design a VE Day Medal

This medal celebrated the end of the First World War and was given to the soldiers who had fought in the war. It is a great symbol of pride and its design is symbolic. The rainbow symbolises calm after the storm and are the colours of the Allied nations with red at its centre. It includes The dates of the war and the winged figure is 'Victory'. Your challenge is to create a medal for the British soldiers who served in the Second World War.





Captain Tom Moore has been in the news recently because of his incredible achievement. Write a letter to Captain Tom expressing thanks for his tremendous effort. Explain how his effort made you feel.
