Profile Learning

Joe Wicks: 5-Minute Move Workout 3 Touch the Sky

1. Start with your feet a bit wider than your shoulders.
2. Bend your knees.
3. Touch the floor.
4. Stand up straight.
5. Stretch your arms high above your head.



Joe Wicks: 5-Minute Move Workout 3 Star Jump Sprint

1. Start with your feet close together.
2. Jump and land with your feet wide apart.
3. Stretch your arms out above your head.
4. Jump your feet in and your arms down.
5. If you hear "Sprint", run as fast as you can on the spot!



Joe Wicks: 5-Minute Move Workout 3 Climb the Rope

1. Pretend to climb a rope!
2. Reach your hands above your head one at a time and pull the rope down.
3. Lift your knees high and climb on the spot.



Joe Wicks: 5-Minute Move Workout 3 Touch Toes, Clap Hands

1. Sit down on the floor.
2. Legs out in front of you.
3. Stretch your arms to touch your toes.
4. Stand up.
5. Clap your hands above your head.



Joe Wicks: 5-Minute Move Workout 3 Lunge

1. Start with your feet together.
2. Step back with one leg.
3. Touch your front foot with your hand.
4. Stand up straight.
5. Repeat with your other leg.
6. Keep going!




Write a list of things you would need to take to the beach.






Craft Instructions

Paper Plate Sun

Supplies


- Yellow and orange tissue paper, cut up into squares
- Yellow wool or ribbon
- Yellow paper
- One paper plate
- PVA glue
- Sticky tape
- Ruler



- Scissors
- Pencil



1 Spread PVA glue thinly all over the paper plate. Then cover the centre of the plate with the squares of orange tissue paper.



2 Continue to build up layers of tissue paper, working from the middle out, sticking them down with glue. Also stick lighter shades of orange, then yellow to make a gradual change to yellow.




3 Place the yellow paper landscape, then use a ruler and pencil to draw lines going horizontally along it. Draw the lines from the top to the bottom of the paper, using the width of the ruler to separate each line.



4 Using scissors, cut along each line; this should leave you with strips of card a ruler width in thickness.



5 Make a loop out of each yellow strip by gluing the ends together.



6 Using sticky tape or glue, stick the loops of yellow paper at equal distances around the edge of the paper plate.



7 Use a hole punch to make a hole at the edge of the bowl, between two loops.



8 Thread a loop of yellow ribbon or wool through the hole and tie so that the sunshine can be hung.

Craft Instructions

Seaside In A Bottle

Supplies

- Plastic water bottle
- Sand
- Assortment of shells
- Pebbles
- Funnel
- Blue food colouring
- Washing up liquid



- Card
- Fine line pen
- Ribbon or string
- Hole punch



1 Using a funnel, pour sand into the plastic bottle until it is $\frac{1}{4}$ full.



2 Now choose objects to make your seaside scene! We used shells and pebbles.



3 Add a few drops of blue food colouring and washing up liquid to the water.



4 Top the bottle up with water, again using the funnel to pour.



5 Screw the lid tightly onto the bottle. Now place it on its side and allow the contents to settle. You should end up with your very own seaside scene!



6 Now make a tag for your bottle. Using scissors, cut out a small rectangular shape from the card. Then use a hole punch to make a hole at one end. We stained ours with tea to make it look old.



7 Using a fine line pen, write a message such as 'My Seaside in a Bottle' onto the tag.



8 Thread a length of ribbon or wool round the neck of the bottle and tie the tag on to it.
