You wanted the opportunity to scan in additional work.	We bld We are now using Class Notebook on Teams for children to submit written work. There is no expectation that parents/ carers should scan in any additional work but should you wish, work can be uploaded to your child's class Team or into their Class Notebook. Your class teacher would be happy to advise on how to do this if you need any help.
You wanted easier access to the weekly timetable as it was sometimes tricky to find it on the class Team homepage.	Your child's weekly timetable can now be found as a tab at the very top of the class Team homepage. You may need to click on '1 more' if your class' page already has several tabs.
You wanted some printed work packs in addition to the live/ recorded lessons and follow-up tasks	Work packs appropriate to each year group have now been made available for all children in school.
That it was sometimes difficult to balance scheduled lessons, interventions and 1:1 sessions with the needs of your family.	We appreciate that every family's circumstances are different and that you know your child's individual needs. If you are unable to attend a session, this is not a problem, just let your child's class teacher know in advance wherever possible. Class teacher's can be contacted via the Teams Chat or by emailing <u>info.hart@nllt.co.uk</u> You can also decline 1:1 sessions in your child's calendar on MS Teams. Your child's class teacher will be happy to show you how to do this if you are unsure.
That you wanted more art/creative activities for your children.	We have introduced live music lessons for all our KS2 pupils. If you still need an instrument, please contact your child's class teacher who can arrange for you to collect one. Art sessions have been arranged for the children for Spring 2 with a focus on developing self-reflection and evaluative skills. These sessions will provide opportunities to recall and apply previously taught art skills.
