Key Vocabulary

waterproof, water resistant, absorbent, stretchy, tough, warm, plastic, wood, metal, paper, glass

Key Knowledge

Material is what something is made of.

Waterproof means that water cannot get through the material and will stay dry.

Water resistant means eventually water will get through the material.

If something is absorbent, then it soaks up the liquid.

If something is stretchy it can be made longer or wider.

Tough means something is strong and will not break easily.

Winter, snow, frost, weather

Key Knowledge

Winter is the coldest season.

In winter we have colder weather, **sometimes snow and frost**, the trees have no leaves.

A form of transport is something that takes or carries (people or goods) from one place to another.

Transport was different a long time ago.

Fast-forward means to make a video move forward quicky.

Rewind means to make a video move backwards quickly.

To make a video play on the iPad, you have to press the triangle button.

To fast-forward a video you need to press the right arrow button.
