We can add black to make a colour darker and white to make a colour lighter.

We can make our paint thinner by adding water.

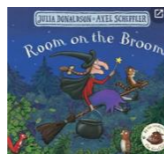

Understanding The World

The Natural World – History: Do we always wear the same clothes?

Key Vocabulary

Clothes, top hats, flat caps, shoes, dresses, suits, shorts.

Key Knowledge

We wear clothes to cover our bodies and protect our skin from the sun and often to keep us warm.

Clothes have not always looked like they do now.

A long time ago ladies wore big dresses and hats, men wore suits and top hats.

Some men wore flat caps and shorts.

Not everyone had shoes to protect their feet.

The Natural World – Science : Wind

Key Vocabulary

Wind, sail, change, windmill, power.

Key Knowledge

Wind can make things work.

Wind can make the windmill turn.

Wind helps the turbine to turn around and it makes energy.

Wind helps the sail on a boat to stay up and change direction.

Computing

To learn what a keyboard is and how to locate relevant keys, e.g., typing their name.

To learn how to log in and log out of a simple account, e.g., Numbots.

To understand why we need to log out.

To continue to develop basic mouse skills such as moving and clicking.

To use a simple online paint tool to create digital art.

Key Vocabulary

Keyboard, keys, typing, letters, spacebar. Log in, log out, mouse, click, open, close, drag.

Key Knowledge

The keyboard has lots of letters and numbers on it.

The letters on a keyboard are not in the same order as the alphabet.

The mouse/mouse pad moves where the arrow is on the screen.

You click the mouse button to open/close something on the screen.

Press the letter and number keys for the username and password.

Logging out is important so other people cannot go on your account.

Religious Education: Let's find out about Raksha Bandhan.

Key Vocabulary Hindu, Raksha Bandhan, brother, sister protection, evil, love, duty, Rakhi, bracelet, Aarti, talik, gifts

Key Knowledge

It is special to have brothers and sisters and Hindu's have a special celebration called Raksha Banghan.

RB is also known as Rakhi.

The traditions:

Brothers and sisters face each other. The sisters tie a rakhi (bracelet) made form coloured cotton or silk around their brothers wrist.

The rakhi symbolises protection from evil

After the sister says a special prayer and performs an Aarti ceremony- special toy lit with candles that is rotated around the brothers face in an offering then puts a talik on their brothers forehead.

The brother makes a special promise to look after and protect their sisters

They feed sweets and hug then carry on celebrating.

It celebrates and strengthens the bond of love between brothers and sisters.
