Other living things share our school such as plants and minibeasts.

A habitat is the home of an animal or plant.

Decay means to rot. Leave and food can decay.

Key Knowledge

We can order times in our lives into chronological order.

Chronological order is ordering things that happen in order of when they happened. We think about what happened first, next and last.

Materials used to build houses in the past were different to materials that we can use to build houses today.

In the past houses were built from stone and mud and materials people could find naturally. Houses over time used different materials like bricks, cement, and slate tiles.

Key Knowledge

Key Knowledge

The special book for Muslims is called the Qur'an. It tells Muslims the direct word of Allah (their name for their God).

The Qur'an teaches Muslims to live good lives, worship God and treat other people. The Qur'an is looked after by Muslims. They wash themselves so they don't get it dirty, they wrap it in cloth to keep it nice and new and place it up high so it can't be damaged. The Torah is the Jewish Holy book.

The word Torah means teaching in Hebrew. It shows how God wants Jews to live.

Music - rhythm


Key Vocabulary
