Illustrator – the person who has drawn the pictures for the book

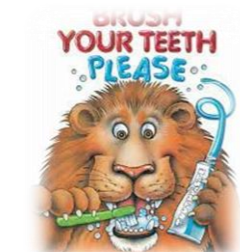
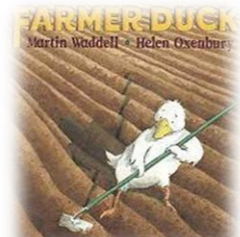
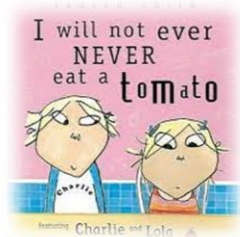
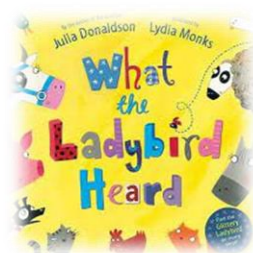
Blurb - a short description of a book

Vocabulary

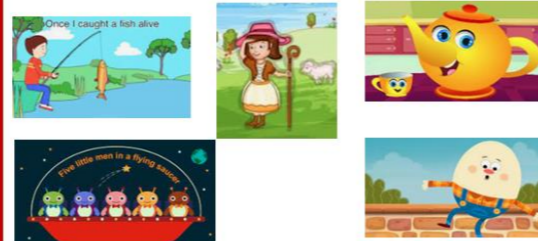
Sketch, pencil, dark/light, outline, leaves, petals, soft/hard, curved straight, shape
